CITY OF VALLEJO PROVIDES COVID-19 UPDATE

VALLEJO, CA – The City of Vallejo and <u>Solano County Public Health</u> continue to monitor local conditions and circumstances associated with the 2019 Novel Coronavirus, COVID-19. As the lead local agency, Solano Public Health is working with state and federal partners to keep local governments informed and up-to-date on this rapidly evolving pandemic. Community Mitigation

The City has been advised that we are moving away from monitoring and prevention, and into mitigation. We are all responsible for taking part in community mitigation to slow down spread of COVID-19, which will support our health care sector to continue to treat patients without overwhelming the already challenged healthcare system. City recommends posting these posters in public places as a reminder of what to do. The Center for Disease Control released this Community Mitigation document, for non-pharmaceutical interventions to help slow transmission of the virus in communities, including these tips:

What to do if you get sick:

- Stay home and call your doctor.
- Avoid public areas and public transportation.
- Call your healthcare provider and let them know about your symptoms. This will help them take care of you and keep other people from getting infected or exposed.
- If you are not sick enough to be hospitalized, you can recover at home. Follow CDC instructions for how to take care of yourself at home.

Solano Public Health Department released <u>Guidance for Vulnerable Populations at High Risk for Severe Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19)</u> (en español). These recommendations address transmission of coronavirus within Solano County. We are not impacted by the presence of cruise

ship evacuees at Travis Air Force Base in Fairfield who are under federal quarantine, and therefore are not interacting directly with our community members.

State Health & Emergency Officials released guidance to prepare and protect homeless Californians and service providers from COVID-19, available here.

Another way to show support is by donating blood, as donation levels have plummeted in the last couple weeks.

Requirements on Social Gatherings

California Governor Gavin Newsom Issued an <u>Executive Order</u> further enhancing guidelines released yesterday. Among these orders is a requirement on the postponement or cancelation of gatherings at least the end of March as follows:

- Non-essential gatherings must be limited to no more than 250 people, while smaller events can proceed only if the organizers can implement social distancing of 6 feet per person.
- Gatherings of individuals who are at higher risk for severe illness from COVID-19 should be limited to no more than 10 people, while also following social distancing guidelines (ie. retirement facilities, assisted living facilities, developmental homes, and support groups for people with health conditions).

Social distancing is a practice recommended by public health officials to stop or slow down the spread of contagious diseases. It requires the creation of physical space between individuals who may spread certain infectious diseases. The key is to minimize the number of gatherings as much as possible and to achieve space between individuals when events or activities cannot be modified, postponed, or canceled.

The California Department of Public Heath goes on to report that these guidelines do not apply to activities such as attendance at regular school classes, work, essential services, transportation, airport travel, shopping and congregate living. Read additional information here.

Vallejo City Unified School District

VCUSD is working closely with Solano County Public Health to monitor faculty, staff and students. At this time, it is not recommended the school be canceled. Custodial staff at every VCUSD school continues to follow the recommended cleaning procedures daily, with extra effort on areas considered high-risk and high-touch.
