CITY OF VALLEJO COVID-19 UPDATE #8

VALLEJO, CA – The City of Vallejo and Solano County Public Health continue to monitor local conditions and circumstances associated with COVID-19. The County cannot release the location of origin for active cases, but does recommend to assume a universal risk of exposure, continue sheltering-at-home and practicing social distancing when you must leave your home.

City of Vallejo Services

City facilities will be closed to the public through April 26. If you cannot get a hold of a representative of the City for regular City business, please call the City's COVID-19 line at (707) 648-8605 or e-mail COVID19@cityofvallejo.net. Under a local declaration of emergency, the City Manager in his role as Emergency Services Director has released five **executive orders** ratified by the City Council on March 24.

Essential building permits may still be processed by following these **steps**. Essential permits include, but are not limited to, the following: re-roof, water heater, residential furnace and/or air conditioning, plumbing repair, electrical repair, electric or gas service. Every effort will be made to accommodate all inspection requests on issued permits, when scheduled by following the instructions included with the issued permit card or using **eTRAKIT**. Water Department

Vallejo-operated drinking water service continues normally. Vallejo's drinking water is high quality and meets or exceeds all safety and regulatory requirements, tested daily. Our water treatment plants are designed to remove and inactivate pathogens including viruses and bacteria. Additionally, we maintain a consistent level of disinfectant in the distribution pipes to ensure the water stays safe as it travels to customer homes and businesses. During these times of concern, your Vallejo drinking water is one less thing to worry about.

For Water Billing, please call (707) 648-4345 or email **waterbilling@cityofvallejo.net**. The City has temporarily suspended charging water customers a late fee on their past-due water accounts, effective immediately.

To report main breaks or water leaks in the street during normal business hours, please call (707) 648-5235. Business hours are 7:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday through Thursday, and 7:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Fridays. To report main breaks or water leaks in the street after hours, please call (707) 648-4313.

Wellness Checks

The City Team is making outbound calls to residents that have been identified as vulnerable or at-risk. The team is performing a general check-in to identify immediate needs and express concern for their wellbeing. Once needs have been identified, the City aims to pair the resident with an agency partner. The City is also working with a Solano County team of medical advisors and case managers who can triage any critical needs as quickly as possible. **The Salvation Army** partnered with the City of Vallejo who provided traffic control, and were able to help 600 people during their food distribution this week.

Wipes Clog Pipes! An important message from Vallejo Flood & Wastewater District. Vallejoans are doing an amazing job keeping wipes where they belong ... in the trash. Late last week, Novato Sanitary District experienced a major sewage problem caused by sanitary wipes flushed down residential toilets. People are using cleaning wipes, baby wipes, wet wipes -- wipes of all kinds -- in record numbers to disinfect during the coronavirus outbreak. When they are not properly

disposed of in the trash, they threaten wastewater treatment plants and can also pose a danger to home plumbing, even if the product is labeled "flushable." Your pipes will thank you!

US Census Survey

While the community keeps busy at work and at home, a reminder to fill out your **U.S. Census Bureau** survey, which have been mailed out. The survey can be completed online right now, in just a couple of minutes, from a cell phone or other device by clicking **here**.

Despite everything going on, it's important that everyone in Vallejo completes a Census survey. A complete and accurate Census count will help ensure our community gets its share of federal funding and political representation. The census provides critical data that lawmakers, business owners, teachers, and many others use to provide daily services, products, and support for the community. Every year, billions of dollars in federal funding go to resources based on census date, including: hospitals, fire departments, schools, roads, and more. The results of the census also determine the number of seats each state will have in the U.S. House of Representatives, and they are used to draw congressional and state legislative districts.

REAL ID

Acting Secretary Chad Wolf releases **statement** on the REAL ID enforcement deadline being pushed back one year to October 1, 2021 due to the closure of DMVs.

<u>Laxes</u>

The **U.S. Department of the Treasury** announced Tax Day would be moved from April 15 to July 15.

Federal Student Loans

The **U.S. Department of Education** is temporarily waiving interest on all federally held student loans and has directed federal lenders to suspend student loan payments for 60 days.
