What is Participatory Budgeting in Vallejo?

In November 2011, Vallejo voters passed Measure B, a one percent sales tax, to restore and enhance services. On April 17, 2012, the City Council established the first city-wide Participatory Budgeting (PB) process in the United States. PB enables taxpayers to work with government to help make budget decisions, while involving taxpayers in a unique and innovative method of managing public budgets. Through PB the City aims to more closely engage residents in their government. Each year the City Council provides a portion of the Measure B Revenues to be allocated through PB.

The PB Steering Committee outlined four goals for Vallejo's PB process: 1) improve the City of Vallejo, 2) engage the community, 3) transform democracy, and 4) open up government.

There are four major steps in the PB process:

- 1. Idea Collection Community meetings are held in locations throughout the City where residents generate public project ideas. The in-person assemblies are complemented by a website where residents can submit project ideas online.
- 2. Proposal Development Residents volunteer to serve as budget delegates on a committee tasked with screening project ideas for eligibility, prioritizing ideas based on public benefit and need, and developing those ideas into detailed proposals for a public vote.
- 3. Voting Expos Voting takes place over several days in various locations around Vallejo and online. Expos display the proposals on the ballot for residents to learn more. Any Vallejo resident age 16 and older can vote in the PB election.
- 4. Funding and Implementation The projects receiving the greatest number of votes are approved by City Council.

In the first two cycles of PB, more than 10,000 residents participated, generating more than 1,400 project ideas. So far, 20 projects were recommended by voters and approved by the City Council totaling more than \$5.6 million in funding. The projects support capital improvements, programs, and services, including street and sidewalk repairs, parks improvements, public safety cameras, community gardens, new band instruments for schools, summer youth internships, a fire rescue truck, and public art.

PB is more than a consultation—it has given residents an opportunity to participate in the City decision-making in an unprecedented way and builds community capacity and social capital. Vallejo residents who participated in PB said their circles of acquaintances grew and they were more likely to cooperate with neighbors to take on community issues. PB has become a catalyst for Vallejo's reformation, and residents have a restored sense of pride.


